STROLL THROUGH GEOLOGICAL HISTORY



WELCOME TO THE WERK-FORUM & FOSSIL MUSEUM

The 'Werkforum' is Holcim (Süddeutschland) GmbH's communications and information centre. It provides both a venue for building industry functions and cultural events and creates a connection from the company to the public. The fossils recovered from the oil shale that date back around 180 million years also make the Fossil Museum an inviting place to visit.

The cement plant utilises the raw materials of limestone and oil shale for cement production. During the mining of the oil shale in particular some extraordinarily well preserved fossils get uncovered. Specialists search out, recover and prepare these fossilised finds and analyse them scientifically. Without the mining of the oil shale this 'Fossil Treasure Trove' would not exist.

Petrified marine creatures from the oil shale of Dotternhausen form the main focus of the Fossil Museum. There are also fossils shown from other Jurassic strata from the area around Dotternhausen.



THE WORLD OF FOSSILS VIBRANTLY CONVEYED

Palaeontologist Dr. Annette Schmid-Röhl, the director of the Fossil Museum, awakes the spirit of discovery with her explanations and presents geological history in an entertaining fashion. Children and teenagers experience the 'fossilised world' in a new way. School classes go on a fascinating journey into the past For school classes we have prepared a 'Museum Rally'. WELCOME TO OUR WORLD: FROM RAW MATERIALS TO BUILDING MATERIALS

In our Werkforum and Fossil Museum you are naturally also able to learn a bit about what we do. In the entrance area you will see from the 3-D landscape model that our cement works is situated right between the two sites of raw material deposits important for our cement production. The limestone gets extracted up on the Plettenberg hill overlooking Dotternhausen and the oil shale is obtained from the area north of Dormettingen. On the flowchart you can follow the route that the raw materials take right through to the finished cement. The touchscreen on the large monitor lets you choose what and how much you want to learn about Holcim, cement production and the museum.

HAMMER & CHISEL IN HAND...

... in search of fossilised witnesses of earth histroy.

Children find the search for fossils a pure joy. And not just children! Many adults, collectors and adventurous types are also to be found all year round on the 'rummage site' in front of the cement plant Werkforum in Dotternhausen. Sometimes the fossil hunters make finds with the naked eye: shells and ammonites can't be missed as the layers of oil shale are cracked open.

In return for a small deposit at the Werkforum reception desk you get a hammer, chisel and a pair of protective glasses – and then the search for treasure can begin!

COMFALONG FIND OUT GET INVOLVED **SCHIFFFRERLEBNIS** DORMETTINGEN

From oil shale quarry to Schiefererlebnis. Land restoration in a special way.

Oil shale is a valuable and significant raw material for the cement plant in Dotterenhausen. Until the year 2000 it had been extracted from the area between the cement plant and the village of Dormettingen.

Today in the former quarry an extraordinary parkland has been created. This was only made possible by a joint undertaking between Holcim and the community of Dormettingen, supported by the EU and the state of Baden-Württemberg.

Here the theme of oil shale and all of its historical aspects are represented, including: the geology of the countryside, natural rock to building material, cement production to cement recycling, quarrying to land restoration, outstanding fossils dating from hundreds of millions of years, culminating in current day flora and fauna.

Waiting for you are attractions such as the quarry playground, the oil shale lake, the restaurant with its lakeside terrace, the sizeable fossil rummage site with prepared specimens and an open-air stage in the shape of an ammonite, an ideal location for an open-air cinema or for concerts and theatre performances.

Outside from the park there is a nearby informative foot path kept as a remembrance of the oil shale guarrying at the end of World War II. The connection to the Schlichem trail takes you over a rustic wooden walkway along the solitary meandering stream. In this open grazing land the preciousness of the landscape and the large abundance of species can be revered. This has only been achieved through a well managed grazing plan involving donkeys, sheep and goats.
